- How DOL and the states will cooperate in the management of those systems


• • Why Expedited Recommendations?

- The need for improvement to the Workforce and Labor Market Information system has been dramatically magnified by the global pandemic.
- There have been, and continue to be, significant changes in the labor market that create challenges for employers, jobseekers, educators, and policy makers.
- Large allocations of resources are currently available for deployment to restore efficient economic activity.
- There is uncertainty at all levels with how to effectively invest those resources for maximum impact.

Recommendation #1

Advocate for the adoption of <u>Enhanced Unemployment</u> <u>Insurance Wage Records</u> by including additional information:

- 1. Occupational Job Title
- 2. Hours Worked
- 3. Job Site Location



Improve data and information on the changing nature of work through a new Department of Labor working group.

Recommendation #3

Adequately fund State workforce and Labor Market Information infrastructure to meet 21st century demands for data-driven decision making
