


NASWA is **the national leader** working with policymakers on issues impacting state workforce agencies.

NASWA's **overall approach** is focused on helping improve your state's workforce and economic development outcomes.






### SIDES IMPLEMENTATIONS BEFORE, DURING, OR AFTER MODERNIZATION??

- Familiarity with the data and processes reduces the chance of building redundancies; reduces lift for data migration
- May interrupt code freeze; COTS system may not have all exchanges available.

- Train on all the SIDES exchanges at once
- There is a risk of being unable to complete the work

- More available resources
- Difficult to reopen for implementation
